The Wine:

50% Grenache, 50% Cinsault from the Guadalupe Valley. These grapes were hand harvested and processed artisanally by Sitara with her friends and family to make this truly unique wine. From our back porch to yours, capture our joie de vivre in every intoxicating glass of this summertime wine.

In Wine We Lust:

The winemaker, Sitara, locally known as “Baja Valley Girl,” has been making wine in the Guadalupe Valley since 2012. She began by making wine on her back porch, using a spare bedroom to age the wines in barrel, and selling the wine from her front porch tasting bar. All of the wines produced by Sitara are lovingly crafted, friendly and approachable.

Tasting Notes:

Color: Strawberry.

Aromas: Rose petals, orange blossom, tarragon, saffras

Flavors and Textures: Bright and elegant with a creamy mouthfeel.

This “painted rosé” is a lovely marriage of fruit and savory notes.

Look for pie cherries, pineapple, white pepper and fresh oysters.

Food Pairing: Savory Chinese steamed dumplings, mixed green salad with grilled prawns, lavender pana cotta.

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
